**Hotel du Lac** by Anita Brookner**[F/BRO]**

This story recounts the holiday of Edith Hope, meek, unmarried and thirty-nine, who, on the mend from a disastrous love affair, becomes intimately involved with her fellow guests at the Swiss Hotel du Lac.

**Dark Winter** by H.B. Broome [W/BRO]

Though the townsfolk desperately need a doctor, Connie wonders if he will stay any longer than he has to and she wishes that she didn't care one way or another.

**Winter Chill** by Jon Cleary [M/CLE]

Orville Brame, prominent lawyer and president of the American Bar Association, is found shot through the heart, slumped in a monorail, silently circling downtown Sydney. The next day, the body of a security guard is fished out of the harbor. During the ensuing investigation, a talented rookie cop is ruthlessly gunned down. **Scarpetta's Winter Table** by Patricia Cornwell [F/COR]

Virginia's chief medical examiner Dr. Kay Scarpetta and her friends and family come together for the holidays to cook and celebrate in a special novella that includes Christmas recipes and photographs.

**The Alpine Pursuit** by Mary Daheim [M/DAH]

When the opening night of the Alpine Council Dramatic Club's latest production culminates in the murder of one of the actors, local newspaper editor Emma Lord assists sheriff Milo Dodge in solving the mystery.

**Snow Placed to Die** by Mary Daheim [M/DAH]

Bed and breakfast hostess Judith McMonigie Flynn and her zany cousin Renie find themselves stranded by a fierce storm with ten suspects and a corpse when they are asked to help cater the telephone company's annual winter retreat at remote Mountain Goat lodge.

**Winter Range** by Claire Davis [F/DAV]

Ike Parsons is the Sheriff of a small Montana town, with a reputation for fairness, common sense and kindness. When he hears that Chas Stubblefield has fallen on hard times in the bitter winter, he heads out to the rancher's spread to offer assistance. What Ike finds shocks him to his core: cattle starving in the snow, or freezing where they stand and a brooding Stubblefield near bankruptcy, living off the meat of his dying, too proud to accept help.

**Dark Winter** by William Dietrich [F/DIE]

Imagine you're standing at the very bottom of the planet. Fierce winter winds howl out on the icescape. The night is illuminated by the brilliant aurora. There is no possibility of fight, no possibility of outside aid. Then, imagine that among the group of people around you, the people you must work with, live with and trust with your life, there is at least one killer...

**Dawn on a Distant Shore** by Sara Donati [F/DON]

Settler Elizabeth Bonner must cross the frozen wilderness of New York State in the winter of 1794 in a desperate bid to save her husband from being hanged as an American spy.

**A Spell of Winter** by Helen Dunmore [LP/F/DUN]

Abandoned by their parents, Catherine and her brother, Rob, are left to the care of their mysterious grandfather, living in an enclosed and stifling world, where their only solace is their relationship with each other.

**The Winter Garden Mystery** by Carola Dunn [M/DUN]  
[LP/M/DUN]

In England, 1923, the Honourable Daisy Dalrymple has made a decision that, while shocking to her class, is in perfect keeping with the spirit of the times. Rather than live with relatives until she marries, she has undertaken to earn her own living with her writing. What she finds in Occles Hall is a household under the thumb of the ill tempered and demanding Lady Valeria. The discovery of the body of a pregnant maid buried in the winter garden does nothing to improve Lady Valeria's mood.

**The Memory Keeper's Daughter** by Kim Edwards [LP/F/EDW]

In a tale spanning twenty-five-years, a doctor delivers his newborn twins during a snowstorm and rashly deciding to protect his wife from their baby daughter's affliction with Down Syndrome, turns her over to a nurse, who secretly raises the child.

**The Winter People** by John Ehle [F/EHL]

It is late fall when Collie Wright sees a man moving through the woods towards her cabin on the edge of the small mountain community where she lives alone with her baby. She gets out her butcher knife, puts Jonathan down and waits. To her relief, the man turns out to be only a lost traveler with his young daughter.

**Winter Games** by John Feinstein [M/FEI]

Sleepy Shelter Island is abuzz: the local high school basketball star, as yet unsigned, is being wooed by every major college coach in the country. Reporter Bobby Kelleher gets caught up in the excitement and finds himself under suspicion when an old friend, now an assistant coach of Minnesota State University, is murdered.

**Redbird Christmas** by Fanny Flagg [CAS/F/FLA][F/FLA]

In a tiny and remote Alabama town, an unexpected, unusual and life-transforming event that occurs on one Christmas morning changes a family and a town forever.

**Blueberry Muffin Murder** by Joanne Fluke [M/FLU]

Bakery owner and sleuth Hannah Swensen is on the case when Connie Mac, the pompous host of a cable TV cooking show who has been chosen to bake this year's official winter Carnival cake, is murdered while eating one of Hannah's famous blueberry muffins.

**Winter of the Wolves** by James N. Frey [F/FRE]

While he was serving in the Special Forces toward the end of the Vietnam War, Tom Croft was recruited by a secret organization called the Exchange to "carry on the fight against the Communists." For many years, Tom performed covert assignments around the world with enthusiasm and efficiency, but now, with the end of the cold war. Tom is burned out and sickened by some of the things he's done. He resigns and settles in a village in the Adirondacks to start a new life.

**The Dead of Winter** by Paula Gosling [M/GOS]

It's the season when Blackwater Bay freezes over and ice fishing spells excitement for a handful of hardy locals. But Jess Gibbons couldn't care less. To her, Michigan in January is cold and dull: almost as dull as her job teaching home economics to unruly teen girls at the high school; almost as dull as her life. Suddenly she spies an old ice fisherman running wildly to shore after a day on the Blackwater Bay. The old man has just discovered a fish-nibbled corpse floating up into an ice hole.

**In the Land of Winter** by Richard Grant [F/GRA]

This is a story of Pippa Rede, loving single mother and young, contemporary which, struggling for subsistence in a frigid and wooded northeastern corner of our country. Imposing strangers have burst into Pippa's world, narrow-mindedly accusing her of dark, satanic practices. Gentle, unobtrusive Pippa, whose answers to a life full of questions have always been "yes", has been labeled a monster and left homeless, jobless and childless to face the longest, coldest most desperate nights of the year all alone.

**A Killer In Winter** by Susanna Gregory [M/GRE]

The winter of 1354 is as bad as anyone can remember: as heavy snow smothers the countryside, ice chokes the flourmills, causing the price of food to spiral upwards once more. But however cold the weather gets, for two individuals it is about to get even colder. A drunken attempt at blackmail by Norbert Tulyet, errant scholar of the Franciscan Hostel of Ovyng, leaves him dead at the hostel door. And in St. Michael's church a second unidentified body holds an even greater mystery,

Michael Devlin, an 11-year-old Irish American, meets Rabbi Hirsch, recently arrived from Europe and in return for teaching the rabbi about baseball and English, the rabbi teaches Michael Yiddish and tells him about Prague, until an Irish gang becomes violent in its anti-Semitism.

**Winter of the Wolf Moon** by Steve Hamilton [M/HAM]

Alex McKnight has a souvenir of his days as a cop – a bullet lodged too near his heart to be removed. He also has a guilty conscience about the death of his partner in that same shooting and now he is left alone in his Spartan log cabin, taking his meals at the nearby roadhouse, finding company there when he wants it. When a young Native American woman comes to him asking for help, McKnight feels bound to protect her.

**A Winter Marriage** by Kerry Hardie [F/HAR]

Marrying for financial security instead of love, Hannie Bennet marries Ned Renvyle, a writer and world traveler setting down on a farm in the Irish countryside, only to find her marriage has become a prison and she is alienated from those around her.

**The Longest Winter** by Julie Harris [F/HAR]

In 1911, a boy from Abbeville, South Carolina, had his first taste of flying. In 1926, two years after the plane crash death of his best friend, John Robert Shaw attempted a solo flight record in a refitted Curtiss Jenny, sponsored by a Miami newspaper. On April 23, 1926, half of the journey was completed. On April 27, his plane was caught in a storm, went down, and for seventeen years he was missing, presumed dead.

**Blue Deer Thaw** by Jamie Harrison [M/HAR]

A mystery set in the Montana town of Blue Deer finds Sheriff Jules Clement coping with an out-of-control bachelor party, a frozen woman and a valuable art collection, not to mention the upcoming wedding of some close friends.

**Winter's Tale** by Mark Helprin [F/HEL]

When master mechanic Peter Lake attempts to rob a mansion on the Upper West Side, young Beverly Penn, the terminally ill daughter of the house, catches him and their subsequent love sends Peter on a desperate personal journey.

**The Center of Winter** by Marya Hornbacher [F/HOR]

In the aftermath of her husband's devastating suicide, Claire Schiller moves with their two young children into the home of her in-laws during an oppressive Minnesota winter and shares unexpected moments of comfort, healing and humor.

**Snow Mountain Passage** by James D. Houston [F/HOU]

Depicts the hardships, tragedy and devastating starvation that confronted the Donner party, which became trapped by winter snows in the Sierra Nevada's, through the eyes of James Frazier Reed and his eight-year-old daughter, Parry.

**Burning Marguerite** by Elizabeth Inness-Brown [F/INN]

Awakening on a cold winter morning to find the body of his ninety-four-year-old "Tante" Marguerite Deo lying dead outside his cabin, carpenter James Jack must confront the mystery of her death and the secrets that have impacted his own life.

**Winter Kill** by James A. Janke [W/JAN]

Even though Matt Jenner is a heap younger than scrapper Caleb Miller, the two cowpokes are more than just partners. After the twosome is duped by a crooked lawman into bringing a load of gold through treacherous frontier country, they realize just what good friends they are. Will the two friends lose their hearts and their lives in their attempt to prove their innocence?

**Winter of the Raven** by Janice Kay Johnson [F/JOH]

To the rigid society of the 1880's, Kate Hewitt's upbringing was bound to make her an outcast: She was raised among her missionary father's congregants – the Haida tribe of the Queen Charlotte Islands. She practiced a most unladylike hobby – photography. Finally the Reverend Hewitt sent his daughter to civilized Victoria, British Columbia and before Kate could protest her banishment, the minister was murdered.

**Come Winter** by Douglas C. Jones [F/JON]

The author gives us his finest achievement as a novelist: a tapestry both lustrous and shadowed of the rural southwest turning on the currents of progress out of the dark and turbulent eddies of the late nineteenth century.

**Flat Lake in Winter** by Joseph T. Klempner [LP/F/KLE][F/KLE]

New York defense attorney Matthew Fielder has quixotically left a law practice and urban living to build himself a cabin in the Adirondack woods and get by on a legal and pension and whatever small lawyer work comes his way. His client is Jonathan Hamilton, who is regarded in the small rural community as “nearly retarded” or, more charitably, “slow”. The young man called the authorities one frosty morning to say his wealthy grandparents, with whom he lives, have been “hurt real bad.” The police found the couple had been brutally and bloody slashed to death. Fielder's job is to save the boy's life.

**Winter Moon** by Dean Koontz [LP/F/KOO]

Policeman Jack McGarvey connects the killing spree of a Hollywood director with a vision witnessed by an old caretaker on a lonely Montana ranch.

**Fires of Winter** by Johanna Lindsey [LP/F/LIN]

A rival Viking chief in Norway abducts Brenna, King Angus's favorite daughter and makes her a house slave for his son Garrick but she refuses to do women's work.

**Winter Fire** by Elizabeth Lowell [F/LOW]

Orphaned at thirteen, a mail-order bride at fourteen, widowed at sixteen, Sarah Kennedy has learned to depend upon no one but herself, reserving all her love for her younger brother Conner, and for the wounded hawks she heals and returns to the air.

**White-Out** by James Vance Marshall [F/MAR]

The sole survivor of a 1942 World War II mission to the Antarctic shares his extraordinary story of survival after a German U-boat nearly destroyed their encampment.

**A Clash of Kings** by George R.R. Martin [FANTASY/MAR]

Five separate factions vie for control of the realm of the late Lord Eddard Stark, while an ancient form of magic an everlasting winter and an unearthly army threaten to return.

**Winter Lights** by Jan McDaniel [F/MCD]

Recovering from the after effects of an airplane crash, highly successful business woman Kate Smithers retreats to her hometown of Shady Pointe for the holidays. In the safety of her parents' home, she hopes to escape from her horrible memories of the crash and from the relentless pursuit of reporters.

**Winter Rose** by Patricia A. McKillys [FANTASY/MCK]

Some said the dying words of Nial Lynn, murdered by his own son, were a wicked curse. To others, it was a winter's tale spun by firelight on cold, dark nights. But when Corbet Lynn came to rebuild his family estate, memories of his grandfather's curse were rekindled by young and old, and rumors filled the heavy air of summer.

**Winter of Change** by Betty Neels [F/NEE]

At twenty-one, Mary Jane Pettigrew was perfectly able to look after herself, but it came as quite a surprise to discover she had inherited a large house and an income to go with it. There was, of course, a catch and his name was Fabian van der Blocq, who had been appointed Mary Jane's guardian. She couldn't even marry without his consent! Mary Jane wasn't going to let Fabian have it all his own way. But that was easier said than done!

**Winter House** by Carol O'Connell [CAS/M/OCO][M/OCO]

When a burglar is caught in the act and killed by an ice pick-wielding home owner, Mallory discovers that the home owner is actually a long-lost child who vanished sixty years earlier following the massacre of her entire family with an ice pick.

**The Winter Soldier** by Diana Palmer [F/PAL]

Most everyone in Jacobsville, Texas, steered clear of taciturn Cy Parks. However, spirited Lisa Monroe wasn't exactly quaking in her boots and electrified the formidable loner with her sweetly tantalizing kisses. Their fiery passion escalated when the winter soldier returned to the line of duty and claimed the lovely Lisa as his bride, to shield her from a revenge-seeking desperado.

**Dead Of Winter** by P.J. Parrish [F/PAR]

In the quaint tourist town of Loon Lake, Michigan, a killer is taking his vengeance. One by one, the bodies are found, brutally executed, with mysteriously coded death cards placed beside each corpse, the gruesome signature of a psychopath. The only sound louder than doors and windows being locked against evil is the sound of hearts beating in terror.

**The Winter Wolf** by Richard Parry [F/PAR]

America's last frontier, Alaska is a forbidding place of great natural beauty, harsh weather and dangerous men far from the reaches of the law. Far rougher than Dodge, Leadville or Tombstone, the frozen boomtowns of Skagway and Nome are filled with saloons, brothels and fugitives out to get rich. It is into this atmosphere that Wyatt Earp brings his wife, Josephine to finally strike it rich in the Alaskan gold fields.

Christmas wishes, Kwanzaa kisses and New Years near misses. Holiday romance has a magic all its own and can heat up even the coldest winter night. Sit back and embrace the joy of this very special time of year, when dreams of desire really do come true...

**A Trust Betrayed** by Candace M. Robb [M/ROB]

In the spring of 1297, with her husband missing since winter and believed to be caught up in the Scottish rebellion against the English, Margaret Kerr sets out alone to find Roger and uncover the truth about his cousin's murder.

**Born on Ice** by Nora Roberts [F/ROB]

Enjoying a spell of peace and quiet when a harsh winter storm chases visitors away from her bed and breakfast, Brianna Concannon anticipates the arrival of Grayson Thane, an American mystery writer with a painful past.

**Fifty Degrees Below** by Stanley Robinson [NB/F/ROB]

After years of denial and non-action, a near future Earth faces a crossroad when it is threatened with the dire implications of global warming, an environmental crisis that ironically could unleash a devastating Ice Age on the planet.

**Winter Winds** by Gayle Roper [F/ROP]

After a tragedy riddled early life, Dori MacAllister has made a quiet place for herself on the West Coast, far from the landscape of her earlier heartbreaks. When she receives word that the man who raised her is gravely ill, she is drawn back to a place full of love, longing and betrayal.

**Winter and Night** by S.J. Rozan [M/ROZ]

Private investigator Bill Smith tracks a fifteen-year-old boy who has escaped police custody back to his home town in New Jersey, where he hopes to learn more about why the boy is on the run.

**Winter Prey** by John Sandford [CAS/F/SAN][LP/F/SAN][F/SAN]

It is winter in the remote, dark Wisconsin woods, but the chill in the local sheriff's bones has nothing to do with the weather. The extravagance of the crime is new to him: the murdered man, woman and child; the machete-like knife through the man's head; the ashes of the fire consumed house spread over the ice and snow. **In the Bleak Midwinter** by Julia Spencer-Fleming [F/SPE]

Clare Fergusson, the first female priest of an Episcopal church in Millers Kill, New York, finds herself immersed in murder when a newborn baby is abandoned and a young mother is brutally slain, forcing her to dig deeply into the town's secrets.
