### Library Cards Changed!

Lansing Public Library has ceased printing our patron's home address on their library card, but our residency requirements have not changed.

**Pay Your Fines with a Credit Card!** Lansing Library has partnered with the office of the Illinois State Treasurer to offer E-Pay. Patrons can use E-Pay to make payments of fines or donate to Friends of Lansing Library over the Internet with MasterCard, Discover or American Express, or an e-check. A small transaction fee is added by the issuing banks. Visit our website for details!

### Obtaining a Library Card

The Circulation Department would like to remind residents to bring the proper documents with you when you apply for a library card. Library cards are issued to Lansing residents free-of-charge with proper identification to prove residency, such as a valid photo I.D. and two acceptable items with your current Lansing address. If the photo I.D. shows your current Lansing address, you only need to provide one additional acceptable item with your current Lansing address, such as a current utility bill. Lansing residents under the age of 18 must have a parent or legal guardian, with proper identification, sign for them.
